How much does it cost to remove a telecommunications tower?

The cost to remove a telecommunications tower, the foundation, the underground cabling, and any remaining equipment that needs to be removed is from \$50,000-\$75,000. The telecommunications company is not in a hurry to remove towers "unnecessarily", so the property owner would be responsible for this cost if they are the one requesting it.

Can a telecoms operator impose a tenancy on a mast site?

Operators will not have a second bite of the cherry! In a recent case, the Upper Tribunal considered whether telecoms operators can seek an order imposing a tenancy of a mast site under the Electronic Communication Code, following an unsuccessful application under the Landlord and Tenant Act 1954.

Unless agreement is reached on the timescales for doing so, the owner can apply to the Lands Tribunal for an order requiring the operator to remove the equipment.
